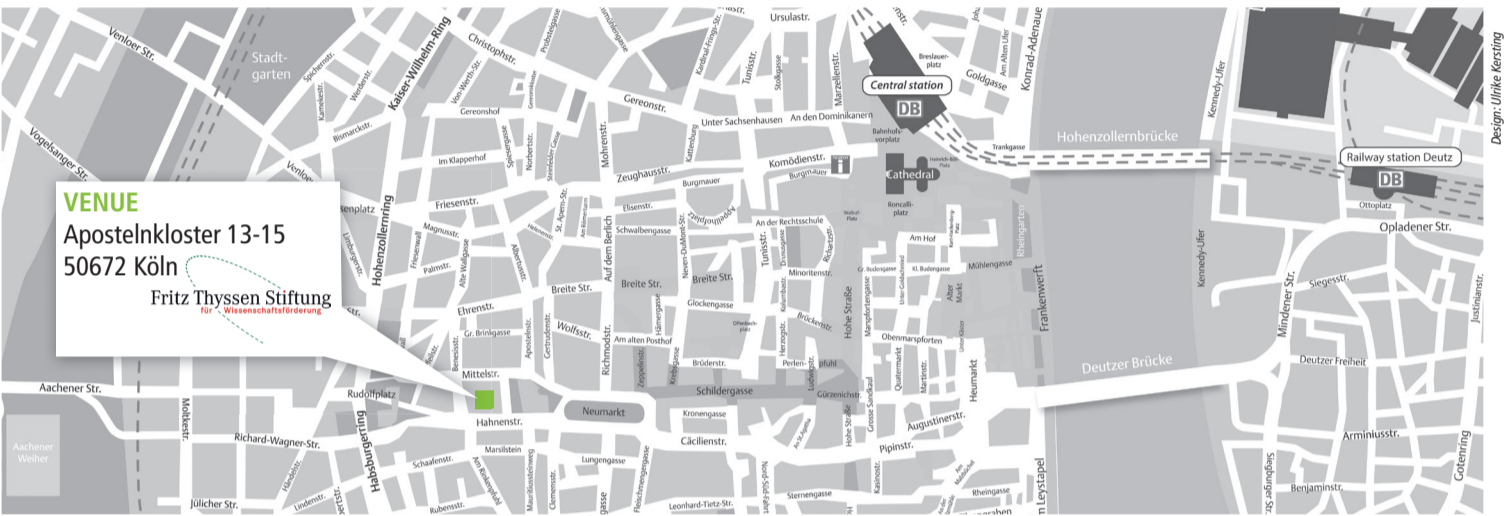

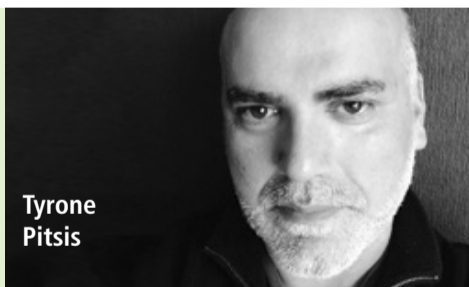

Tyrone Pitsis

Professor Tyrone Pitsis is Professor of Strategy, Technology & Society at Durham University Business School. He joined Durham University in 2018 from Leeds University where he was Pro-Dean of the faculty and Professor of Strategy. Tyrone was born in Sydney, Australia and graduated from the University of New South Wales (BSc.Sc. Honours, majoring in Psychology) and PhD (Management) from The University of Technology, Sydney. He was previously Associate Professor of Organizational Behaviour at The University of Technology, Sydney. He has also held appointments at The University of Sydney, EDHEC, and Newcastle University.



Toni Pierenkemper

Toni Pierenkemper is a Professor of Economic and Social History. Trained at the University of Münster and the London School of Economics, he taught at Münster (1985-1989), at the University of Saarbrücken (1989-1990), and the Goethe University in Frankfurt (1990-1997). From 1997 to 2010 he was the Director of the Institute for Economic and Social History at the University of Cologne.

Toni Pierenkemper is a member of the Historical Commission for Silesia and Managing Editor of the Economic History Yearbook (Jahrbuch für Wirtschaftsgeschichte). From 1993 to 1994 he held the Konrad-Adenauer-Professorship at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. In his research he focusses on regional industrialization.

Among his prolific publications are *Umstrittene Revolutionen: Die Industrialisierung im 19. Jahrhundert*, *The German Economy during the 19th Century*, and *Geschichte des modernen ökonomischen Denkens: Große Ökonomen und ihre Ideen*. Most recently, he published *Beschäftigung und Arbeitsmarkt: Entstehung und Entwicklung der Erwerbsgesellschaft in Deutschland, 1800 – 2000* (2017) and *Wirtschaft und Wirtschaftspolitik in Deutschland* (together with Rainer Fremdling, 2018).

Toni is going to talk about „The German Tradition in Business Schools“.



Jörg Sydow

Jörg Sydow is Chair for Inter-Firm Cooperation at Freie Universität Berlin. A former Professor of Business Administration at Wuppertal, he joined the Free University in 1995. His recent research activities focus on building a managerial concept of "reflexive network logics development" which relates the strategic conduct of firms in networks to the specific conditions of organizational fields, such as regions and industries. Special attention is paid to the impact of historical conditions on ongoing processes, for example on the development of organizational and technological paths.

Currently, this concept is being elaborated for the fields of the media industry and optical technologies. Prof. Sydow has published extensively both in German and in English (in Organization Studies among others). He has worked with research partners from the Fraunhofer Institute, various German and international universities and is the recipient of a number of research grants by the German Science Foundation (DFG).

Jörg is going to talk about "Organizational Path Dependence and Beyond".
